Clean Up Australia Day Success

With 150 volunteers working hard to collect a total of 252 bags of rubbish, Melton Shire is cleaner and even more beautiful after the success of Clean Up Australia Day.

Melton Shire Mayor Councillor Justin Mammarella paid tribute to the fantastic work of the volunteers who gave up their time to make their community a nicer place for people to live, work and visit through their efforts.

“Council was pleased to help facilitate the Clean Up Australia Day events in our Shire and everybody worked hard to make it thoroughly worthwhile and successful,” said Cr Mammarella.

“Everyone is aware of the importance of protecting the environment and this was an opportunity to take part in a local event that will also have a positive national impact.

“It’s good to see this event was so well-supported and that more new and different areas were covered by collections this year.”

Among those helping with the clean up efforts was a team of volunteer workers and a staff member from the Melton Visitor Information Centre who took to collecting rubbish around the town’s historic heritage trail.

“Guided tours around the Melton Heritage Trail are being booked up fast, so it was great to see our Visitor Information Centre volunteers their time to make the trail free of litter. That’s real dedication,” said Cr Mammarella.

“I really want to thank all of the volunteers and the CFA for their outstanding support on the day, from collecting rubbish through to providing the expertise of a chef for the thank you barbecue.”

In all, rubbish collections took place at Toolern Creek, Exford Reserve and road areas, Bullum Bullum, **Town Centre Park**, McPherson’s Park, Kororoit Creek, Little Blind Creek, Navan Park, , Hannah Watts Park and Westlake.

Among the items collected were shopping trolleys, bicycles and broken furniture.

“It’s amazing that people think they can pollute our public spaces with their unwanted rubbish. I hope the hard work of the volunteers might just encourage people to think twice before they illegally dump and litter,” said Cr Mammarella.

Volunteer Groups will receive a Certificate of Appreciation from the Mayor for their participation in Clean Up Australia Day.

FMBG March Meeting

Visit to Iramoo Sustainable Community Centre, St. Albans

On Wednesday 21st March seven members met in the car park of the St Albans Campus of the Victoria University to visit Iramoo. From the car park it looked like some portables with a scraggy garden but when we went inside and met Colin and Brett we were amazed at the depth of the work that was being done. Iramoo is situated between the St Albans campus of the Victoria University and the Cairnlea housing estate. This area is also one of the last homes of the legless lizard.

The garden contains species indigenous to the basalt plains. One part of the garden is growing indigenous vegetables, another is a small wetlands area uses recycled water which is becoming a home for frogs, all areas are water wise. They have a seed garden which is developing methods to gather seeds from scarce indigenous plants. The nursery for growing these and other indigenous plants is now developed so Iramoo is now able to sell some of these plants.

It was very interesting for the group to hear Colin talk about the development of Iramoo, about applying for grants, working relationships with other groups and Brimbank Council.

It was encouraging for Friends of the Melton Botanic Garden, as a group on the beginning of our journey to be encouraged by a group that has been on their journey for 10 years and to see what they have achieved and their willingness to share their knowledge and experiences with us.

We said goodnight to Colin and Brett at about 9pm as we went home they went out to join a group of volunteers doing a spider survey.
