## Grow the Garden Days

The Grow the Garden Days have been a great success in 2009. We now need to weed and water until we can start planting again in late April or May.

Why not join us at the next Grow the Garden Days in February 2010 – 10am-noon 2<sup>nd</sup> Thursday and 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday every month.

The weeds in Ryans Creek have gone mad since the December rain and have swamped some areas of the creek. One such weed is the Umbrella Sedge (*Cyperus eragrostis*) which is a perennial weed of roadside gutters and drains and unfortunately it is doing well in Ryans Creek. It is greenish yellow, a number of plants can be seen in the photo below.

## Grants

### Melbourne Water

The final report was submitted for our 2009 grant in January. Allan, Jill and John met with Susan Burns and Julie from Melbourne Water at Ryans Creek on 22<sup>nd</sup> January to look at what had been achieved and discuss our 2010 grant plans.

### Vision for Werribee Plains (V4WP)

We submitted the Second Quarterly Report to V4WP. We completed all our planting as part of this grant by the end of November.

Below is a list of plants we have planted from the V4WP grant in the rehabilitation area of Ryans Creek.

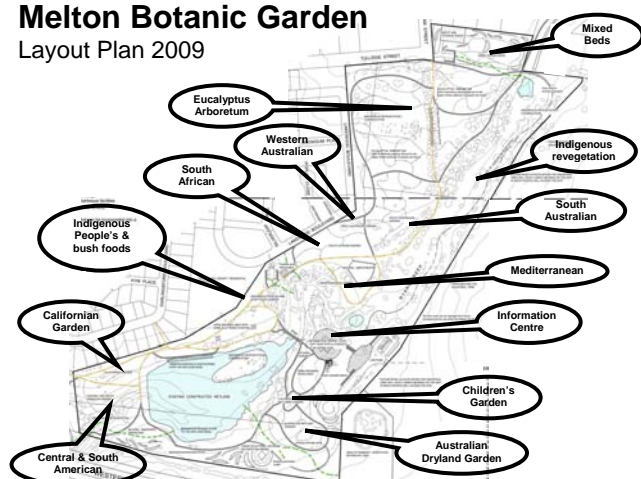
We have printed information and registration forms if anyone would like to consider attending.
